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**WORK CONTINUES ON TIME AND ON BUDGET AT CHA'S WEST
HAVEN PARK**

Making good on its promise to rebuild public housing into new, healthy mixed-income communities, construction work is progressing on schedule for CHA's Westhaven Park.

Part of the Henry Horner mixed-income redevelopment on the city's west side, construction on the current phase of Westhaven Park includes 155 units, of which 87 will be for public housing residents. When the entire redevelopment is completed, there will be a total of 764 units. Approximately 30 percent of these units will be public housing, another third will be designated affordable, and another third will be market rate units.

"The CHA made a promise to change things for the better -- for families, children and seniors," said CHA CEO Terry Peterson. "The progress at Westhaven Park is proof that we intend to keep our word."

The CHA broke ground at Westhaven Park earlier this year.

When completed, Westhaven Park will be the first mixed-income family development to be built on the same land where old, dilapidated CHA public housing buildings once stood
